Propalms TSE Client 6.0.4.x

Release Notes



There are two versions of Propalms Connection manager (PCM) released.

1. PCM v 6.0.4.0
2. PCM v 6.0.4.1

1. PCM v 6.0.4.0

- PCM v 6.0.4.0 is for all users who do not launch TSE applications over TSE SPR or DMZ SPR server.
- This PCM version does not replace/modify the default RDP client files (mstsc.exe, mstscax.dll) available on client machines under \System32 directory. It uses the available RDP client on the machine.
- If your client OS is XP, Win98 or earlier, this PCM will also work for SPR, DMZ-SPR based app launches.

Note: For Vista and Win7 clients, to launch apps over TSE SPR or DMZ SPR, TSE needs RDP client v6.0 or below. If you are not sure, you may install PCM v6.0.4.1 that supports SPR and DMZ-SPR based app launch.

2. PCM v 6.0.4.1

- This PCM replaces RDP client files in system32 for Vista SP* and Win7.
- On uninstall of PCM, it rolls back the RDP client files in system32 to its original version prior to PCM installation.
- The replaced RDP files are saved in '\\Program Files\Propalms Client\BackUp' folder.
- Supports SPR and DMZ SPR on all Windows clients.

Upgrade:

Supports upgrade for all previously released PCM clients from v5.

Supported OS:

Win XP SP*, Win 2000 Pro, Vista SP*, Win 7, Win 2003, Win 2008

Install instructions:

1. Ensure PCM is not running and all TSE User sessions are closed on the client.
2. For *Vista and Win 7*, ensure UAC (User Account Control) is turned off.
3. Install client logged in *with full admin rights*. Preferably local machine 'administrator' account. If UAC is not disabled, the client install may not be 100% successful.

Limitation of PCM v6.0.4.x on Windows 7.

Users may see problems with minimizing and maximizing TSE apps launched with Seamless feature enabled.

This has to do with a compatibility issue of TSE Seamless feature and Win 7 "Desktop Composition" feature.

Disabling "Desktop Composition" resolves the problem but the 'Aero Peek' and 'Transparent Glass' feature will be disabled too. *Disable only if a user has problems with minimizing and maximizing Apps*. This issue is more visible on Win 7 ultimate and Enterprise. Win 7 Home and Professional do not seem to exhibit this problem.

Disabling Desktop Composition on Win 7:

1. Start- Control Panel- System and Security - System (shortcut key: Windows + Pause Break)
2. Click on 'Advanced System Settings' and go to 'Advance' tab.
3. Under 'Performance' click on the 'Settings' button
4. Under 'Visual Effects' , Uncheck the option for 'Enable Desktop Composition'
